

Here's What's Happening in Your Neighborhood

December 2020

Three transportation projects are built or underway in the Ibach area.



Garden Corner Curves

This project will upgrade the corridor that follows 105th Avenue/Blake Street/108th Avenue between Avery and Willow Streets. Until now, people who walk and bike have shared this narrow, constrained roadway with vehicles. The road has sharp curves and limited visibility, offering little or no shoulder. Steep banks and ditches loom just beyond the pavement edge.

Improvements at Garden Corner Curves include:

- ✓ Widening the roadway and adding a new off-road shared use path
- ✓ Pedestrian-activated flashing beacons at Moratoc Drive and Blake/108th
- ✓ A high visibility raised crosswalk
- ✓ A driver feedback sign that displays vehicle speed



Construction got underway at the Garden Corner Curves in late August and will be completed in 2021.

The Other Projects



Ibach St at Ibach Park – **Built!** Crosswalk and pedestrian-activated flashing beacon on Ibach St to more safely access the South side of Ibach Park.



Grahams Ferry Rd at Dogwood St – **Built!** Adds a new pedestrian-activated flashing beacon, high-visibility crosswalk, additional street lighting and ADA-compliant curb ramps.
